DAY 1 (MAR 13): ARRIVAL IN HAVANA

Upon arrival, you will be greeted by your Englishspeaking guide and transferred to your hotel. After check-in, unwind and relax. This afternoon, embark on a walking tour through Havana's colonial old town. This guided stroll will introduce you to significant historical sites and squares, including Plaza Catedral with Hemingway's "Bodeguita," Plaza de Armas with El Templete, and Palacio de los Capitanes Generales, along with the charming Plaza Vieja. In the evening, delight in a special dinner reservation at "Yarini," known for its breathtaking roof terrace and views.

DAY 2 (MAR 14): GET TO KNOW HAVANA

Start your day with a unique experience as original 1950s convertible vintage cars pick you up. Embark on a scenic drive through Havana. Continue to explore various neighborhoods of Havana, mainly built in the last century. The journey includes a stop at Revolution Square and a drive through the enchanting "Parque Almendares" with its mystic Ceiba trees along a romantic river. A highlight of the day is a visit to Marianao, a Havana suburb, where you will attend a rehearsal or training session of "Havana Queens.". Afterward, indulge in a delightful lunch at "Marea," a special restaurant located at Marina Hemingway, Havana's yacht marina. Your day continues with a guided tour to the National Museum of Fine Arts, before returning to your hotel.

DAY 3 (MAR 15): FULL DAY EXCURSION TO VINALES

Depart from Havana for a fullday excursion to the picturesque province of Pinar del Rio. Your journey takes you along the "Ruta de Tabaco" (Tobacco Route) to the village of Viñales, known for its colorful houses and colonial arcades. Along the way, you'll stop at Mirador "Los Jazmines" to enjoy panoramic views of the Mogote Valley. Explore the village and visit a Vequero (tobacco farmer). Lunch is served "criollo" style at "Finca Agro-Ecologica," providing a taste of authentic Cuban cuisine. A unique highlight of the day is a meeting with the Women's Entrepreneurs Association of Viñales, where you'll learn about their projects, challenges, and experiences in private small entrepreneurship in Cuba. In the late afternoon, return to Havana. For the evening, delight in a dinner at Paladar "San Christobal," a hidden gem in Centro Havana, famous for its fusion of afro-Cuban Santeria and the music world of the 1950s.



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DAY 4 (MAR 16): FINE ARTS & ARTISANS IN HAVANA

The day begins with a guided tour of the magnificent Gran Teatro, named after the renowned Cuban prima ballerina Alicia Alonso. Next, explore "Acosta Danza," a prestigious Cuban dance company led by Carlos Acosta, the world-famous Cuban ballet dancer. Continue your artistic journey with a visit to the studio and gallery of young Cuban artist Arian Irsula. During a relaxing "Mojito" session, delve into the world and life of Havana's avantgarde art scene as you explore his private home. Lunch awaits at La Bodega de la Reserve or Paladar "El Atelier" in Vedado. The afternoon includes a potential visit to a Hogar Materna Infantil in Old Havana, dedicated to comprehensive care for pregnant women with special needs. This evening, your journey takes you to a special destination - "Fabrica de Arte," a symbol of the new and trendy Cuba. Before visiting "Fabrica," enjoy dinner at the rooftop terrace of the restaurant "El Cocinero," offering a unique dining experience.



DAY 5 (MAR 17): FEMALE "CHEFS" & VOCAL GIRL POWER

Your morning begins with a pickup by your private guide in American Vintage cars. Venture to an ecological finca on the outskirts of the city, where you'll become acquainted with Cuban seasonal fruits and vegetables. In the afternoon, participate in a cooking class at Casa La Lore in Old Havana, led by female Chef Lorena. Discover the culinary delights of Cuban cuisine as you learn the secrets behind some of its most beloved dishes. Cuba boasts a rich history of female music bands. Explore this musical legacy with a visit to a young Cuban girl band, vocal group, or an Afro-Cuban ensemble during one of their training sessions at their "studio" or "training location." Enjoy a refreshing cocktail as you delve into the complex Cuban music scene, Afro-Cuban roots, and the daily lives and dreams of these talented young musicians. A private performance awaits, specially arranged for your group. This evening, get ready for your farewell dinner experience at the private Paladar "La Guarida." Known as one of "the hardest tables to get in Havana," this emblematic restaurant is set in a unique location, boasting an antique staircase and an inspiring history.





DAY 6 (MAR 18): HAVANA AND DEPARTURE
